


There has been an attempt to shift our perspectives on mission. This has been twofold. Firstly, we have tried to envisage life groups as places where both pastoral care and missions are the responsibility of those who attend a life group. Secondly, we had a series of messages on mission. Over the last year we have continued to support three overseas workers both financially and through prayer. They have been Amos and Perry Mukasa in Uganda; Judy and Victor Gomez in Spain and Filliepe Martinez in Bolivia. Judy and Victor spoke during the mission's series as they were back in NZ on furlough. Filliepe has recently passed away and now rests with Jesus.

In my last AGM report on mission it states that "there is little engagement from the whole body" towards mission. The eldership have been working and praying on this and have recently made some significant changes with our overseas and local mission strategy. Judy and Victor and naturally Filliepe will no longer be supported. We are retaining Amos and Perry as overseas workers. They represent the "there" of mission and hopefully, we pray, that there will be members of the church that want to pick up correspondence with them for their support and encouragement and perhaps go to Uganda in person. The invitation is open!







Later in the year (September) we will be adopting Wade and Erica Gadsby as people we support. This is an exciting change as they represent the 'here but there' of mission. A MOU has been adopted for their support as they continue their good work in Vanuatu. This will hopefully open a way for us to become actively involved in short term mission trips and supporting work with people who have little.

Stu and Lynette Lennox have also been adopted as missionaries sent from our church. So, my time has been spent on these few sheep, searching for them, contacting them, building trust, encouraging, and loving them back closer to the flock of sheep. A number of these sheep have been delegated onto others within the church body who are continuing the work.


Al PH*A* REPORT


